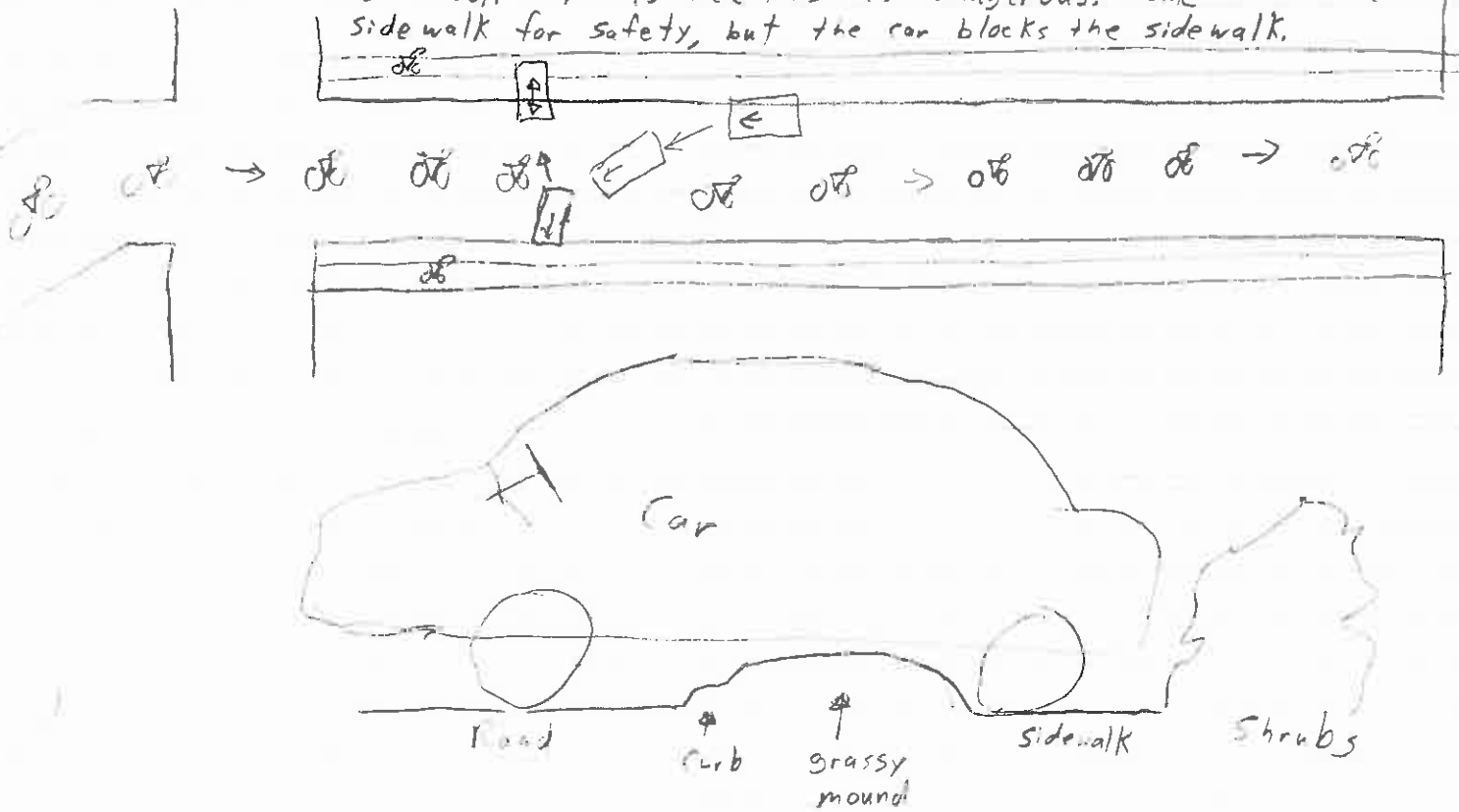


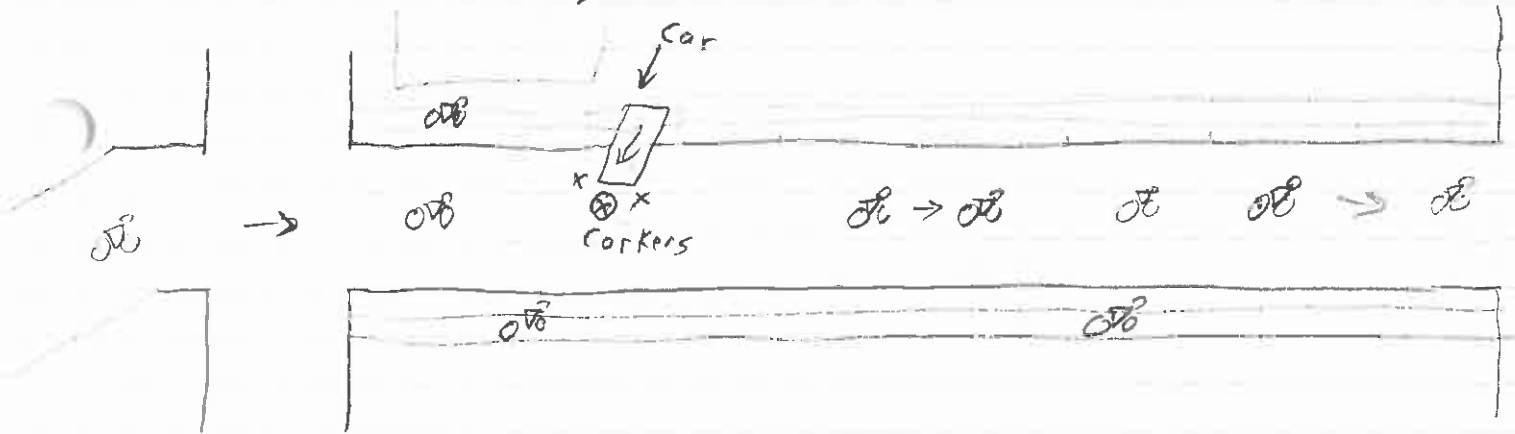
Initial State: Car parked facing west on the north side of the road with a large group of cyclists continuing past heading east. This persists for approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ of the group and possibly 2-5 minutes. There were 150 to 300 people in the group from witness estimates.

First movement: As the stream of cyclists thins, the car pulls into the street. Cyclists see this as dangerous. Some move to the sidewalk for safety, but the car blocks the sidewalk.



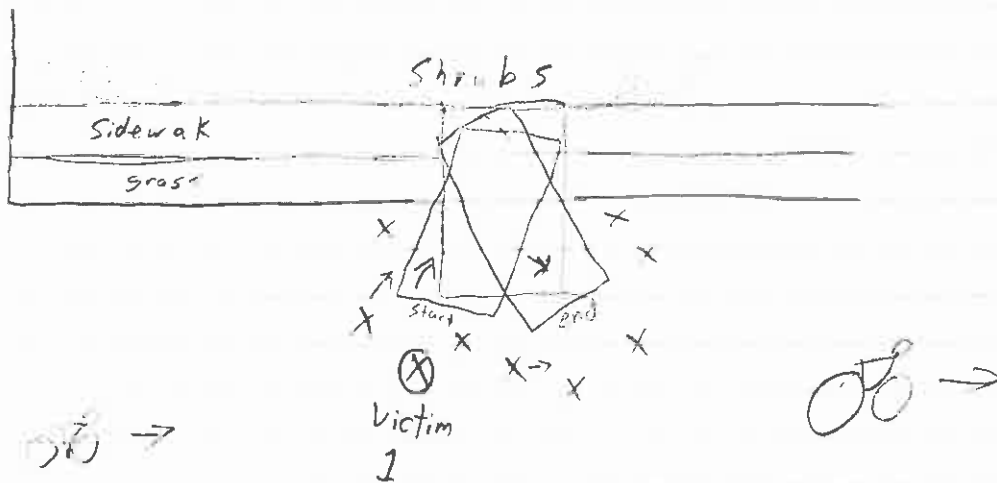
Sidewalk Side View

Second Movement, First Victim:



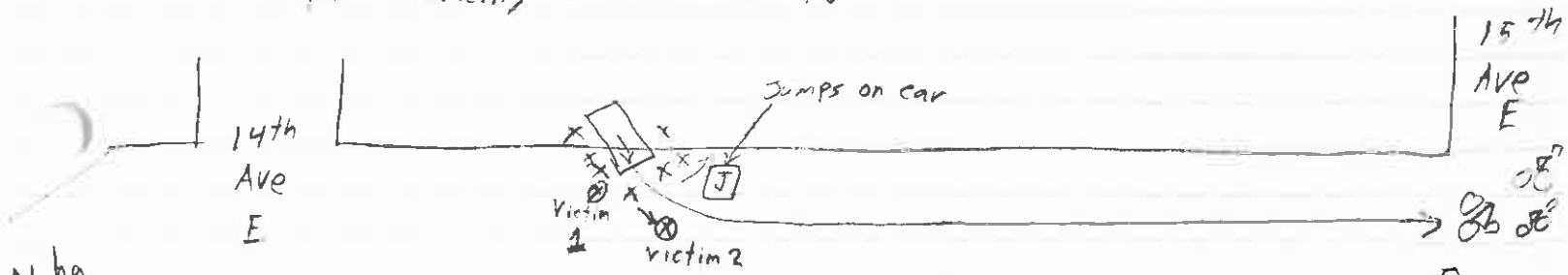
3 Cyclists take position to prevent the erratically moving car from running over the last of the group. The car keeps moving forward and backward, hitting one cyclist, knocking her to the ground and passing the front of the car 2 feet over her body. Cyclists start screaming.

Third Movement: (exploded view)




The car backs away from victim 1 and does a 3 point turn to aim away from this cyclist who is laying motionless in the middle of the road. By the end of this approximately 8 cyclists are around the car. Driver and cyclists are yelling. More cyclists continue to try to get through.

Fourth Movement, Second victim:



The car lurches forward dragging victim 2 for 6 feet before running over his leg. Another cyclist jumps on the hood. The car speeds to 15th where cyclists who heard screams and see a car with a guy on the hood stop the car.

Fifth Movement, third victim:



Cyclists run down the hill. The cyclist on the hood breaks the window. A cyclist from the initial site uses a pocket knife on the car tires to disable the car. A few cyclists stand around as the driver exits the car and apologizes. Another cyclist runs down the hill, hits the driver with a U-lock and runs away.

In the middle of the investigation, the police have a shift change and officers swap. The new officer in charge concludes that the cyclists attacked the driver and that the driver was the victim.
